


Beacon Cove Beach Hut Development Site

Location

Beacon Cove is a beautiful beach located in Torquay, a popular tourist resort in South Devon, England. The Cove is situated at the base of a steep cliff and is sheltered from prevailing winds by the surrounding hills, making it a popular spot for swimming and sunbathing.




including cafes, restaurants and public toilets.
Beacon Cove also forms part of the Agatha
Christie Mile which marks 11 specific locations
along a one mile route around Torquay
seafront, each marked by a centenary plaque.

Torquay is a seaside town located on the east coast of Torbay, a large natural harbour that includes the neighbouring towns of Paignton and Brixham, making up the English Riviera. Torquay is known for its sandy beaches and palm trees, which give it a Mediterranean feel and is a popular year round destination.

History

Historically, Beacon Cove was an important landing site for boats and ships and was used as a harbour for export of local goods such as lymestone and coal. The Cove was also a popular spot for smuggling activities in the 18th and 19th centuries with hidden caves and tunnels providing ideal hiding places for

contraband. In the early 19th Century Beacon Cove became known as a fashionable bathing spot as wealthy visitors to Torquay began to build houses and villas around the area. Beacon Cove was well known as a favourite spot for Agatha Christie to bathe whilst she resided in Torquay.



Description

The freehold site at Beacon Cove is a unique piece of real estate situated right on the beach and located in between the famous Imperial Hotel and Torquay Harbour.


This sheltered spot now has the benefit of planning consent for five modern, contemporary residential beach huts to be used as holiday lets, enjoying this fabulous location.

The planning consent also benefits from permission to build a separate food and beverage kiosk located to the side of the development.

The consent allows for the units to be used for short term holiday use only.

The Site

The site should be of interest to any potential developer/investor and/or operator who will appreciate the huge potential of building these units and the significant revenue that would be generated from letting the units.





The scheme also includes a food and beverage kiosk, which could either be let or operated by the owner of the site; again, with huge potential to generate significant turnover, not only from the beach huts but the many visitors to the Beacon Cove and the surrounding area.

Beacon Cove is currently managed by Torbay Council. The site has disabled access via a sloping walkway and is has a lockable entrance gate for security. The Beach has consistently achieved Excellent status for water quality and was named as a Marine Conservation Recommended beach for 2023. Parking is found above the beach at Beacon Quay pay & display car park.









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
